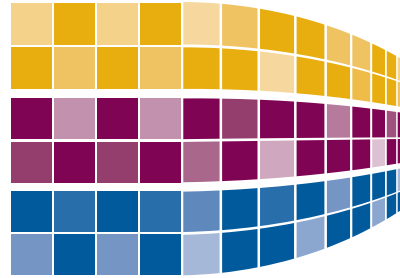

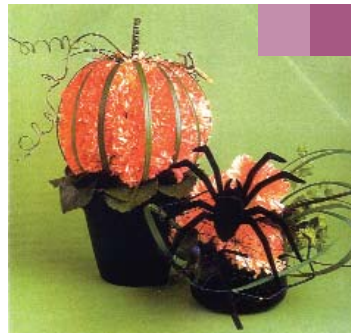

The performance includes a wide range of Flamenco dances designed to express all various emotions from the happiness of an Alegrias to the sadness of a Solea.

The program also includes an explanation of castanet playing, foot work and Flamenco guitar and singing.

During the performance, the artists will also link the appearance, style and techniques of Flamenco to the multi-cultural development of the Hispanic culture and various other cultures. ■
