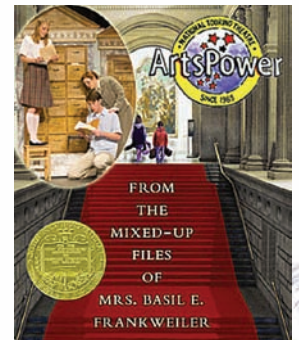

## Do it Yourself Auto Repair Assistance

In addition to a large collection of auto repair manuals that are available to be checked out by patrons, the Library also subscribes to two databases that supply the same information electronically. AllData Online is a consumer version of the AllData Professional car repair database used by many repair shops. Unfortunately the use of the database is limited by its publisher to in Library use only so you must access it on one of the library's computers. However the Auto Repair Reference Center is accessible from home through the library's website. Both databases feature diagrams and pictures and step by step instructions for most repair procedures. In addition to these automobile repair guides, we also subscribe to the Small Engine Repair Reference Center which provides the same types of assistance for small engines such as lawn mowers, string trimmers, and snow blowers.
