2011-2012 Budget Vote on

The Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library's Trustee Election and Budget Vote will be held on Tuesday, April 5, from 9 a.m.-9 p.m. at the Library. The proposed budget for 2011-2012 preserves important existing programs and staff for our community, while carrying an increase in spending that is largely centered on a mandated pension contribution and health insurance increase.

As in previous years, the Library's administration and Board of Trustees worked tirelessly to develop the lowest possible budget with a minimal impact on taxpayers. Library tax increases have been essentially flat for the past two years. This year's projected increase is primarily due to the rising costs of mandated pension contributions, along with the significant health insurance increases that all businesses are facing. "Throughout the budget development process – and certainly over the past several years we have been fully aware of the economic difficulties faced by our residents, so we exercised all possible efficiencies, including not replacing positions," said Library Director Kerri Rosalia. "We are proud to

have been able to offer budgets with such minimal increases these past two years. While our proposed budget for 2011-2012 is higher than the past two, it allows us to preserve the programs and services our community expects and deserves." An approved budget will cost an average household in the community an additional \$27 for the next year.

In addition to the budget vote, there will be a trustee election to fill a five-year term currently held by Anthony Saggio.

The Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library 2011-2012 budget vote will be held on Tuesday, April 5, 2011 from 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m. at the Community Library. Voters must be (1) 18 years of age or older, (2) a citizen of the U.S., (3) a resident of the district for at least 30 days, and (4) registered to vote. Voters who are not already registered may register at the Library from 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m. on March 29th, 2011.

In order to vote, you must be: (1) 18 years of age or older, (2) a citizen of the U.S., (3) a resident of the district for at least 30 days, and (4) registered to vote. Voters may register at the Library from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on March 29th, 2011.

The estimated tax rate associated with the proposed operating budget is \$24.64 per \$100 of assessed valuation, which equates to an estimated increase of \$27.04 annually, or an increase of \$2.25 per month for an average household (based on an assessed valuation of \$2,500.00)

A five member Board of Trustees elected by the voters of the district governs the Library.

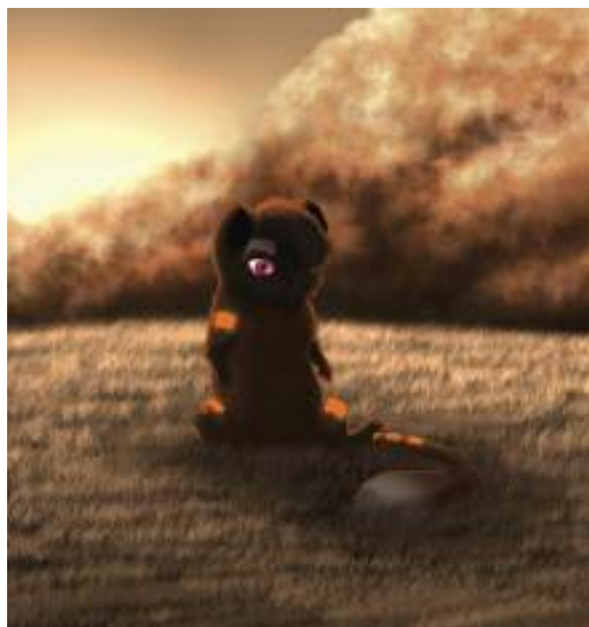

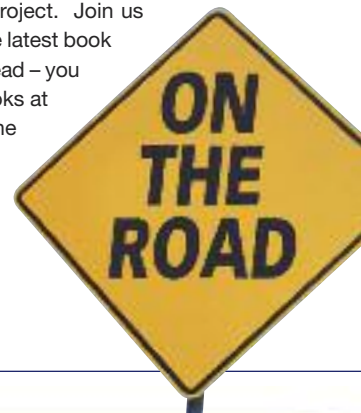
