Trustee Election and Budget Vote

The Community Library's trustee election and budget vote will be Tuesday, April 3, 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m., at the library. Voter registration will be at the library Tuesday, March 27, from 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m.

Five elected trustees govern your Community Library. One trustee is elected each year for a five-year term. The next board term of office is July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2017. Interested candidates should be library advocates, leaders in developing excellent services, and responsive to the needs of the entire community. Petitions nominating board candidates are available and must be filed in the library director's office no later than 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 5.

Absentee ballot applications are available at the circulation desk. All completed absentee ballots must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, April 3, in order to be canvassed for the vote. Voters may register for and receive an absentee ballot to be filled out in-person by the voter no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, April 2.

The regular meeting of the Library Board of Trustees on Monday, March 26, will also include a budget hearing and is open to the public. Information regarding the proposed budget will be available in the library and on our website at <http://www.communitylibrary.org> ■

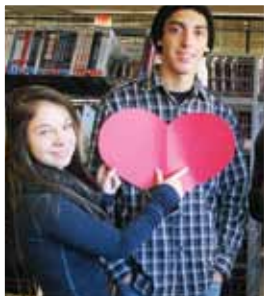

Memories of a Child Survivor of the Holocaust

Sunday, April 1, 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

We invite you to hear Inge Auerbacher, a child survivor of the Holocaust, tell her story. Inge was the last Jewish child born in Kippenheim, a German village. Beginning at age 7, she spent three years in Terezin (Theresienstadt) Concentration Camp in Czechoslovakia, where around 1% of 15,000 children survived.



Inge's life in Terezin was a nightmare.

When she arrived, everything was taken from her except for the clothes she wore and her precious doll, Marlene, which survived the war. Death, fear and hunger were her constant companions. She witnessed the deportation of many of her friends to Auschwitz and was in Terezin when the International Red Cross came to inspect the camp.



Inge is the author of numerous books, including *I Am a Star: Child of the Holocaust*, as well as the recipient of the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, Louis E. Yavner Citizen Award, Queens College of the City University of New York Alumni Star, and many other honors. Don't miss this remarkable woman's story as she brings us back to a very dark time in history.

This program is offered in conjunction with **Long Island Reads** and is open to the public. This year's book selection is *The Lost Wife* by Alyson Richmond, a portion of which is set in Terezin Concentration Camp. ■
