Read One Thousand Books Before Kindergarten

Registration ongoing.

Developing literacy skills begins at birth and continues through the toddler and preschool years. The best way to be sure a child has the skills needed to learn to read is to have someone read aloud to them. **Children who are read to start stronger in school.**

One thousand books sounds like a lot, but if you read only one bedtime story every night for three years you will have read 1095! Read 10 books a week for two years and you will have read 1040! If you read just three books every day for a year, you will have read 1095 books!

Participants will receive a 1KB4K journal and a free book for your child to keep. You will receive another free book after reading 500 books, and a T-shirt when you complete 1000 books. **It's fun, it's free, it's important.** Preschool families with children birth through age 5. ■

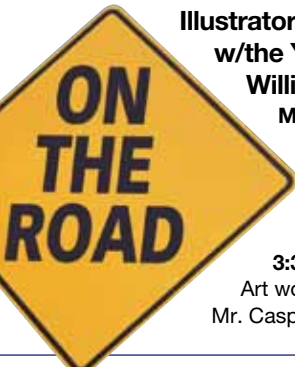

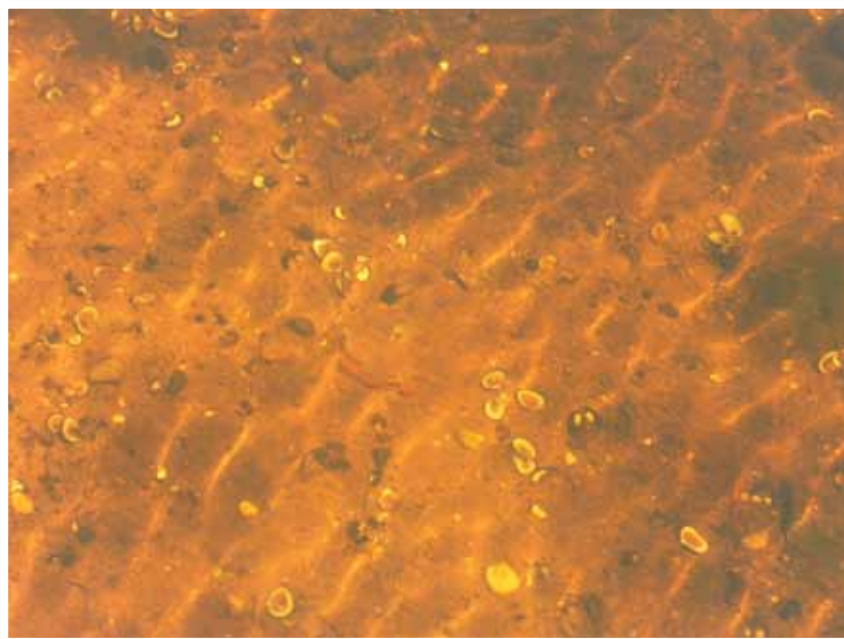
