Petitions nominating board candidates must be filed in the library director's office no later than 5:00 p.m. Monday, March 4.

Absentee ballot applications are available at the front desk. All completed absentee ballots must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, April 2. Voters may register for and receive an absentee ballot, to be filled out in-person by the voter, no later than 5:00 p.m. Monday, April 1.

The regular meeting of the Library Board of Trustees, which includes a budget hearing and is open to the public, has been moved to Monday, March 18, due to school recess. Information on the proposed budget will be available in the library and on our website, www.communitylibrary.org. ■

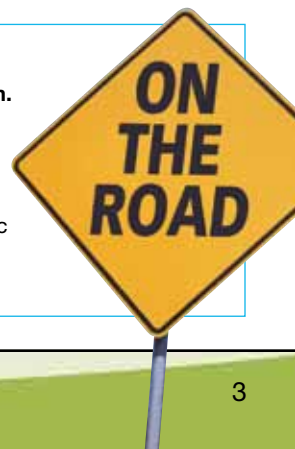
