Located in the Mastic Recreation Center at 15 Herkimer Street, it features 25 desktop computers, high-speed internet access and printing capability. This center provides open computer lab hours on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for adults and teens. Call 657-3743.

In addition to providing computer access to our community, the center offers educational opportunities for all ages. Technology classes including – but not limited to – 3D printing, video game design and coding will be taught, with lessons facilitated by an interactive touchscreen white board. 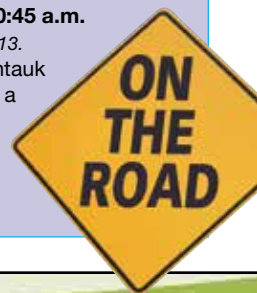

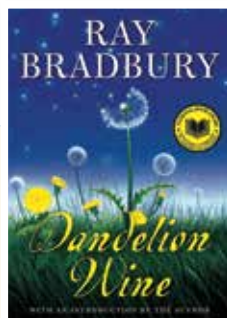
