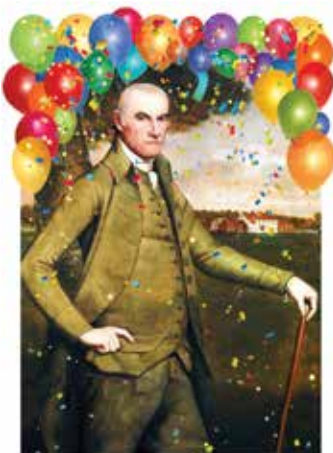

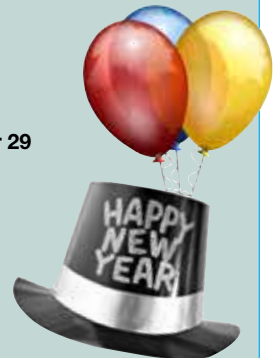

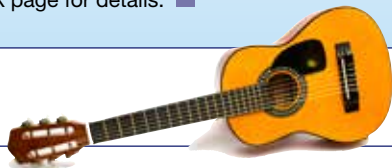

- Check out the personalized iPod with a valid MMSCL card for a loan period of 60 days.

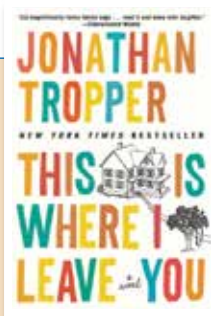

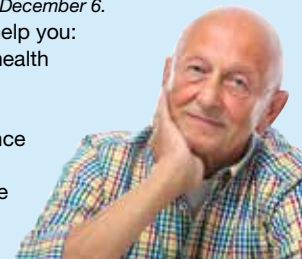
