December 17, 1734 – August 4, 1821

In cooperation with the William Floyd School District, the library is celebrating the birthday of General William Floyd, a local leader in the Revolutionary War and signer of the Declaration of Independence. This year's Floyd celebration focuses on the theme of "courage." Join us on **Saturday, December 17**, for activities for all ages, including:

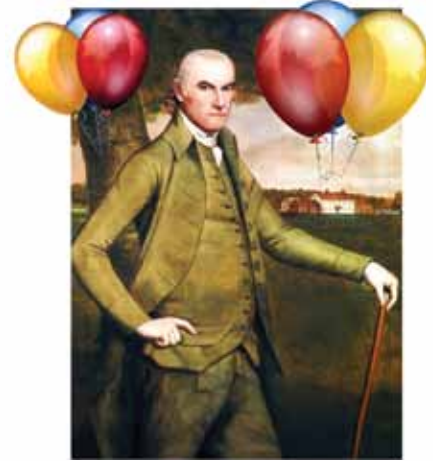
Gallery Crawl in the Library – Local schoolchildren's winning art on the theme of "courage" will be displayed throughout the library.

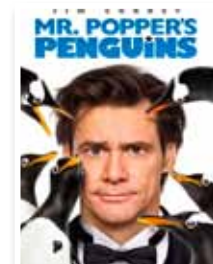

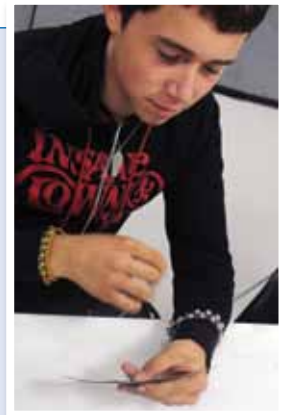

Family Literacy

Grant Award

The New York State Education Department Division of Library Development has awarded the family literacy program **\$28,319.00** for the fiscal year 2011-2012 to continue and expand its current literacy programming. The focus of the grant is to foster parent/child early literacy interaction and learner independence of both English for Speakers of Other Languages parents and their pre-K children in order to increase their use of the public library as an integral part of their child's early literacy development. The grant award allows the library to offer classes 6 days a week and over the summer months when no other ESOL programs are available. ■



Program on Video

Representatives from the National Center for Family Literacy and Better World Books visited the library to film our family literacy program in action. They spent many hours talking to and filming families whose lives have improved as a result of the English for Speakers of Other Languages classes they attend with their preschool children. Highlighted in the video is an interview with literacy student Maria Ruiz and her son Antonio, who expressed how much easier his life is now that his mom can speak English. The National Center for Family Literacy will use the video to encourage other libraries across the country to offer similar programs. Better World Books will use video clips on their website to encourage buying books from a business that funds non-profit organizations, such as the National Center for Family Literacy. ■
