



Exciting New Space for TEENS

One of the best parts of our newly renovated Main library building at 407 Wm. Floyd Parkway is the expanded Teen area. Located on the lower level, it is a sophisticated space where teens in grades 6 through 12 can study, meet up, read, play video and computer games, and hang out in the library with peers of their own age group!





Comfortable Seating

The Teen department has brand new seating in a variety of styles. Whatever your mood may be,

there is a place for you to feel welcome and at ease! Some fun examples are our quad of swivel lounge chairs, sure to be a popular choice for catching up with friends after school. When you are looking for a cozy place to read, our high back reading chairs make the perfect little nook for you. Paired with a little table to keep your devices handy, you can really get lost in a good book wrapped in comfort. There is plenty of other comfy seating, including our fun boulder chairs that rock back and forth, plus lots of seating all around. There's always a place to hang out now, thanks to all of our new furniture designed especially for teens.

Study Areas - for groups and individuals

When we asked what teens wanted to have in the new building, study space was important. That's why we enlarged the whole teen department area, taking over what was previously a large office space to give it to Teens. Now the department is more than twice the size it used to be. Teens needing to study or do homework can use one of our specially designed study chairs that come with a quiet "divider" that gives privacy, and a flip up desk to use your laptop of tablet as needed. Teens working in groups can use one of our many group table setups. We even have a dedicated individual study room just for teens that can be reserved.



Art and Creative Space

So many local teens enjoy creating artwork, and participating in the library's Art Club after school. We have plenty of space to work on art projects at our round tables throughout the Teen area. Mr. Casper recently got the Teen Art Gallery wall setup, and we can't wait to start displaying your new creations throughout the seasons.

Gaming Lounge

With a big screen TV dedicated to gaming, and a new lounge space with a comfortable couch and end tables, gamers can really enjoy the new Teen space. We are planning lots of activities including "mystery" video game tournaments, as well as retro gaming nights. We even have a retro arcade kiosk in the new area.

With more space comes more stuff for teens, so all the titles you want to read will be here. Graphic novels, the latest science fiction and fantasy book series are stocked and waiting for you to check them out.
